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## Looking for Something New in Houseplants?

Why not try the exotic gesneriads? Many of the easiest and most beautiful plants for the home or greenhouse belong to the gesneriad family. The best-known member of the family, the African violet, has over 2400 “cousins” ~ and most of them thrive in our home environment!

What’s a gesneriad? Pronounced correctly either “guess-NARE-ee-ad” or “jess-NARE-ee-ad”, the family includes 146 genera. Many are known by their common names lipstick vine, goldfish plant, flame violet and cape primrose. Most are from the tropical and subtropical regions and are often found growing in humus-filled depressions or rock crevices, on humus-covered forest floors, or epiphytically on trees. Their enormous popularity is attributed to their wide variety of plant sizes, shapes and flowers and colors with hundreds of species suitable for home cultivation. There’s someone for everyone!

*Light* ~ Gesneriads need good, bright light, not exposed to direct sunlight except in the early morning. Fluorescent light setups with lights on 12-16 hours per day and hung an average of 8-16 inches above the plants work well, too.

*Water* ~ Water when the top of the soil is dry, using room temperature water. The soil should be moist, not wet or soggy, and excess water must drain out of the pot. Minerals in well water or softened water may be detrimental to plants. Some gesneriads like *Saintpaulia* require continuous amounts of water, and *Achimenes* become dormant if allowed to dry out even once.

*Temperature* ~ Normal home temperatures between 65-75° F daytime, with a ten-degree drop at night, are considered ideal. Avoid hot or cold drafts such as heating or cooling vents or open doors. Some gesneriads like *streptocarpus*, lipstick vines and goldfish plants may be grown outdoors during the summer in mild climates.

*Fertilizer* ~ A constant feeding method using any good balanced or bloom promoting (one in which the middle number, phosphorous, is higher than the other two) is recommended. Typically, using about ¼ the recommended strength on the label every time you water works well. Once a month, use plain water to flush out accumulated salts.

*Humidity* ~ Most gesneriads come from humid, tropical areas, so an average humidity of 50% will keep them happy. To maintain this level during the dry winter heating (or summer AC) season, mist the plants, or place the pots on a damp pebble-filled tray, or use capillary matting, or run a humidifier.

*Soil and Repotting* ~ The growing medium must be loose and porous to retain moisture, yet provide good drainage. Commercially available AV soils with some perlite added to lighten the mix are appropriate. Or a good mix can be made from equal parts sphagnum peat moss, coarse vermiculite and perlite, with about ½ horticultural lime per gallon. When the root ball is very tight and overgrown, repot to the next size pot.

*Propagation* ~ Gesneriads are easy to propagate. Stem and crown cuttings with the bottom leaves removed can be placed in a covered, soil-filled pot until roots have formed. Many gesneriads, like *Saintpaulia*, will grow from a single leaf. Although gesneriads can be grown from seed, most modern hybrids will not reproduce true from seeds.

To acquire some of these wonderful gesneriads, please come to our show and sale on Saturday, September 18 (1-4) and Sunday, September 19 (11-3).


## From Judy Smith Director Sacramento Valley River District of California Garden Clubs

The *Shepard Garden & Arts Center* is proud to announce its **2ND ANNUAL "FALL FESTIVAL,"** scheduled for October 16th & 17th from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. each day. The event will be held at the Center's facility located at 3330 McKinley Blvd., Sacramento (off 33rd near H Street) adjacent to McKinley Park and the "Fab 40s" in downtown Sacramento.



Well on its way to becoming *the* "not to be missed" fall event, it is attended by not only the Center's club members, their friends and neighbors, but by people from throughout the region. Advertising for the event will include yard signs, on-line community bulletin boards, hundreds of flyers, and PSAs issued to all local radio and television stations. Last year over 2,000 people attended this event!

Once again the Center will be divided into three special-focus sales areas:

**Grand Central Market** — focused on fine arts and crafts, jewelry, and other quality one-of-a-kind gift items.

**In to the Garden** — this area, which includes the Center's patio, will be for items related to gardening and plants, along with other things consistent with a garden theme.

**Bargain Bazaar** — here shoppers will find merchandise for every budget such as previously owned books, gently used items, and other modestly priced goods.

Based on your photos, product descriptions, and/or your work's price range, the jury will choose which of the areas is the most suitable for you. Decision of the jury is final.

#### **Other things you need to know:**

- The event will take place as scheduled, regardless of weather conditions. No refunds for rain or wind.
- Spaces at the show are not separated by dividers, walls, or draping; each vendor must supply their own displays, easels, table skirting (**required**), and all other items needed to facilitate sales. Some spaces have peg-board on the walls that can be used; vendors must supply their own pegs (no hooks). Other spaces have rear cabinets or wooden cubes which must remain in place but can be used for display during the show.
- Space in front of Exit Doors can not be used to display merchandise. Exits must remain clear at all times.
- Spaces may be shared by no more than two for vendors/artists. A Member Club will be considered to be a single vendor/artist.
- Chair(s) will be provided to each vendor by the Center. Please indicate on your application if you will need more than one chair.
- One table is provided for each space at no charge, non-member club participants can rent additional tables for

\$10.00 each. (No charge to SG&AC Member Clubs for additional tables.)

- All tables are to be draped to the floor to give a neat appearance. There is no exception to this requirement. Storage boxes are to be placed under the table or neatly stacked at the rear of the booth. Member clubs may request the use of Center-owned table drapes.
  
- All materials in the Grand Central Market are to be hand-made by the artist. Commercially manufactured materials which have been enhanced by the artist shall not make up more than 50% of merchandise presented for sale. Vendors in the Bargain Bazaar or Garden themed areas may include merchandise which is not hand-made.
  
- All communications regarding the Fall Festival will be done by e-mail. Please be sure to include a clearly printed or typed e-mail address on your form. Applications without this information can not be considered for inclusion in the event. Member Clubs are to designate one person to receive information via e-mail regarding the event.
  
- Each vendor is welcome to bring an assistant to help them during the show. The Center will also be providing "Helpers" to assist you with moving your merchandise and will watch your space while you take a break.
  
- Vendors may, AT THEIR OWN RISK, leave their merchandise in their booths overnight. The venue will be locked each night but the exterior courtyard, although surrounded by a high wall with locked gates, is the least secure portion of the venue. The Center does not accept any responsibility or liability for items damaged or stolen should you choose to leave them.
  
- **NO EARLY BREAK DOWN WILL BE ALLOWED** unless you are completely sold out. Contact an event coordinator for permission to leave if this is the case.
  
- If applying for more than one space, please include separate checks for each individual space to facilitate refunding if we are unable to fully accommodate your request for space.

**PLEASE NOTE THESE REQUIREMENTS -- NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE TO THE FOLLOWING:**


1. Deadline for entry is **September 15, 2010**; Member Club reservation confirmation due by **September 5, 2010**.
2. All exhibitors are required to have resale licenses; copy must accompany application.
3. Application must be accompanied by three photos or a written description of the merchandise you intend to sell, including price range.
4. Clubs that are members of the Shepard Garden and Arts Center receive an automatic 10% discount on the spaces fees listed below. Also, there is no charge for additional tables to Member Clubs. For additional Member Club discounts, see cover letter.
