December 3, 2012

Call to order by President Ken Rothaus.

Scheduling/City Report by Mabel Lotz Roof and ceiling repair- City was contacted and is to come out to inspect the ceiling in the small conference room. Due to the rain, it is not known when the City will conduct the inspection. Irrigation- no update.

Event Committee Spring Sale by Laurie Lee: Laurie was approved as Chair for the Spring Sale on March 23-24, 2013. A budget of \$1000 was approved.

Friends of SGAC by Ed Schroeder and Kelly: next meeting will be on January 7th at 6pm prior to the regular Board Meeting. The focus will be on filling the Board positions and acquiring new members.

Old Business: Sound system/projector - a down payment has been made to Anthony of Associated Sound to order and install the new equipment. Anthony will be in touch with Mabel to schedule the work.

Demo camera - Wayne Martinson agreed to research products available.

Curtains - Board Member John Foster was not in attendance to address work to be done on the north facing window. Therese Ruth will send an e-mail request to John for his attendance at the next Board Meeting. 




